## Kentucky Conference on the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning Creating Prepared Learners

**Proposals due January 23, 2009**

The Kentucky Conference on the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning has merged with the Teacher Quality Summit to offer college faculty and administrators a forum to examine topics related to K-12, adult and postsecondary education. The 9<sup>th</sup> annual conference is jointly sponsored by the Council on Postsecondary Education, Kentucky's public postsecondary institutions, the Association of Independent Kentucky Colleges and Universities, and the Kentucky Association of Colleges for Teacher Education. Presentations, panel discussions, and poster sessions provide conference participants the opportunity to discuss the scholarship of teaching and learning and to share innovative instructional techniques and technologies. Upon completion of the conference, participants will understand major trends in the redesign of education, become aware of key issues facing Kentucky educators, and network with other Kentucky faculty.

The conference will run from Wednesday, May 20, to mid-day Thursday, May 21. Presentation sessions of 50 minutes will be available, as well as poster sessions. We encourage presentations that address Double the Number strategies (<http://cpe.ky.gov/doublethenumbers/>) and initiatives such as meeting the needs of adult learners, developmental education redesign, Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM), P-16, world languages, transfer advising and career pathways. Presenters are expected to engage their audience. Preference will be given to those submissions identifying ways in which they will engage participants (e.g. small group discussion, case study, or problem-based learning) and will be rated higher in the review for acceptance. Because this conference combines K-12 and postsecondary education, please give consideration to integrating your presentation for both audiences.
